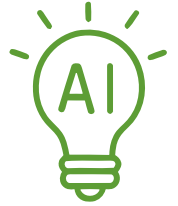

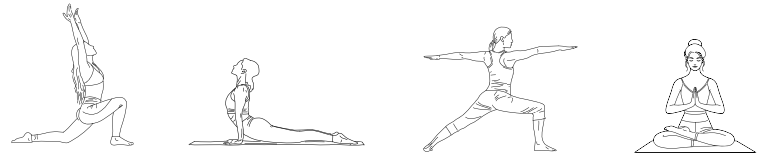
Using AI Safely and Successfully in Everyday Life
